HUMAN IMMUNEDEFICIENCY VIRUS ANTIBODIES AND P24 ANTIGEN			

HIV COMBO Screen

Non-reactive

The 4th generation HIV test is able to detect antibodies and p24 antigen. A non-reactive result most probably indicates that the patient is not infected.  
Other possibilities include:  
1. The sample was taken during the window period, which can be up to about 3 weeks for this test. If HIV infection is clinically suspected, repeat the test in 2-3 weeks' time.  
2. The patient is unable to produce antibodies (take

underlying diseases into consideration). This is a rare cause for a false negative result. If HIV infection is clinically suspected contact the laboratory to discuss alternative diagnostic possibilities.
